Rebecca Rule brings her stories to New Hampton

Well known humorist, author and story teller Rebecca Rule brings her stories of New Hampshire and the characters that make New Hampshire unique to the Gordon Nash Library, New Hampton, NH on January 22 at 7:00 PM. Rebecca is a recent recipient of an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters from New England College and has been collecting and telling stories of New Hampshire and New England for more than fifteen years. Rebecca comes from a long line of New England story tellers and has spent much of her life collecting and telling stories which have their roots bedded in the granite of New Hampshire. The Board of Selectmen will hold a Public Hearing on January 29, 2015 at 7:30 pm, on the updated New Hampton Hazard Mitigation Plan, first adopted in 2009. The plan is a planning tool to be used by the town of New Hampton, as well as other local, state and federal governments in their efforts to reduce the effects from natural or man-made hazards. The Plan includes the identification of natural hazards affecting the town of New Hampton, as identified by the New Hampton Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee. The hazards were reviewed under the following categories: Flood, Wild Land Fire, Drought, Geological Hazards, Severe Wind, Winter Weather, Other Hazards (motor vehicle accidents involving hazardous materials, oil spill, aircraft accident, rabies, etc.).

The New Hampshire Homeland Security and Emergency Management Office (NH HSEM) funded the Plan with matching funds from the Lakes Region Planning Commission. The plan has been reviewed by U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region 1, been evaluated for compliance with Federal Regulations and was found to meet all of the mandatory requirements of the regulations per FEMA correspondence dated, December 30, 2014 .

NEW HAMPSHIRE DEPARTMENT OF SAFETY LAUNCHES FREE EMERGENCY ALERT MOBILE APP

NHDOS CAN NOW SEND LOCATION SPECIFIC WARNINGS TO ANYONE WITH THE APP

CONCORD, NH – The New Hampshire Department of Safety announced Monday the launch of its NH Alerts mobile app, a free tool that notifies users of hazards in the area based upon cellphone location. The NH Alerts app was developed by the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management with federal grants.

“The NH Alerts app takes emergency notification to the next level,” State Homeland Security and Emergency Management Director Perry Plummer said. “Anyone with the NH Alerts app on their phone will know about safety issues in their area, from accidents and road closures, to hazardous weather and active shooters. We can now send messages directly to those people who are in the path of danger. I strongly encourage everyone to download this app.”

The NH Alerts app provides warnings via an audible alert. The types of alerts received are completely customizable allowing the user to determine the frequency with which warnings are received. The NH Alerts app works with iPhone® and Android™ cellphones and is currently available via links on www.ReadyNH.gov . The NH Alerts app is free to anyone including visitors from other states.
